When I call time, you will pass your paper to the right. You will receive a paper from the person to your left. You will read their thoughts on the same statement and write a response back to them.




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Spiegelman

Lives in New York with wife and daughter


Advocates greater understanding of comics

Comic books are usually written as a series.


Graphic novels tell one story in a few volumes.
